'Matte Blanco's Perspective (through a Jungian lens)'

Our first seminar will be an introduction to the ideas of Matte Blanco, giving particular attention to the ways they can be understood to offer a framework which allows Jungian concepts to sit more comfortably with mainstream psychoanalytic presumptions, not least by clarifying and valuing the distinction between the repressed and the unrepressed unconscious.

Our second seminar will attempt a quasi-clinical application of the above to our understanding of both Jung and Winnicott – and the links between them. If you find the theoretical reading too dense - or just too much of it - turn to Winnicott's 'dream' for refreshment, it's short and intrinsically fascinating - and you don't have to do more than just dip into my paper ...
