Please can you read the following in preparation for the seminar on "Bion's Perspective," Saturday 8th November 2025.

## **First Seminar**

In this opening session we will aim to get a handle on some of Bion's core concepts before moving on to a more detailed text in the second seminar.

Please read Nicola Abel-Hirsch (2019). *Bion: An Introduction to His Life and Work.* Routledge. As you read, try to focus particularly on Bion's ideas of container/contained, alpha function, reverie, attacks on linking, working without memory or desire, his symbol O for ultimate truth, and the notion of negative capability.

## **Second Seminar**

In this session we will turn to an original paper from Bion, one that seems particularly relevant when working with borderline patients and where the boundary between psychotic and non-psychotic states becomes central.

Please read Bion, W.R. (1957). "Differentiation of the Psychotic from the Non-Psychotic Part of the Personality." International Journal of Psychoanalysis, 38: 266–275. This paper is also reprinted in Second Thoughts.

I would also like you, if possible, to watch the film A Monster Calls (2016, directed by J.A. Bayona). It provides a powerful illustration of a young person moving between psychotic and non-psychotic states in the context of overwhelming emotional pain.

I look forward to linking these readings and reflections with your own clinical experiences in the afternoon seminar.
